### Bill Sheridan Will be demonstrating Segmented turning

I first got interested in segmented boxes/bowls from another club member and a demo he had done for us. I have been making segmented boxes and bowls for about 4 years.

I will be going over some basic design steps and basic layout of the project. From there we will discuss number of segments per ring and how to calculate the angle, length and width of each segment. We will also be discussing the sled, stop block and other fixtures needed for cutting, sanding and gluing them. From there I'll show the gluing up of each ring, flattening (sanding) and assembling the rings into the project. Finally, turning the assembled project on the lathe.
